

Literacy / C&L

The intent for this term is for pupils to be able to listen and respond to the ideas of others, extend vocabulary and sequence stories. This term our focus story for Talk for Writing is 'Goldilocks and The Three Bears'

- Write labels for food
- Write own name
- Write a caption for / label a picture
- Story sequencing / oral recall
- Re-telling stories with props
- How to make the perfect porridge
- Write a list of characters
- Responds to instructions



Read Write Inc. Our intention is that pupils will learn how to 'read' the initial sounds in words and how those sounds can be written down.

A reading meeting will be held in autumn term to discuss this further.

Maths

The intent of the maths curriculum is to give pupils a deeper understanding of number in order for them to count, recognise numerals, say one more/one less, represent, compare and match quantities.

- Use number names accurately in play, reciting numbers up to 10.
- Comparing two groups of objects saying when they have the same number.
- Using fingers/marks on paper or pictures to represent number.
- Problem solving.
- Number hunts in the environment.
- Subitising games- recognising amounts without counting
- Sorting/ odd one out?
- Number rhymes and songs.

PSED

The intent for this term is to develop the children's self-confidence and self-awareness so that they can make their own choices. Routine and self-regulation will be a focus this term whilst the children are settling into the new environment.

- Making good choices (You Choose)
- Understands that own actions affect other people, Whitehouse Golden Rules
- The Ugly Duckling (what's inside that counts)
- Magic Porridge Pot (Greed)
