

grammar areas including expanded noun phrases and creating imagery. Pupils will then be looking at a range of Greek Myths. Using Talk4Writing, pupils will go on to create their own versions by adapting a classic myth.

Later in the term, we will be investigating an Ancient Greek crime mystery and will write Ancient Greek newspaper reports and witness statements about the event. Additionally, we will create our own information reports about an Ancient Greek god.

The impact will be that pupils will have a better understanding of writing in full sentences within a variety of genres.

GEOGRAPHY

This term, we are focusing on rivers. Our intent is to provide pupils with an understanding of the human and physical aspects of this topic. We will use maps to locate rivers within cities and countries. Pupils will be able to explain how rivers are formed and the journey the water takes from the source to the mouth and also the ability to discuss the water cycle. We will also look at the importance of rivers and their importance to civilisations throughout history.

MUSIC

The intent of our music focus this term is to increase our knowledge of musical notation and understanding of the different musical elements through our glockenspiel playing. We will also develop our singing repertoire making preparation for Harvest. We will increase our experience of singing in two parts.

PSHE

Our intention in our PSHE lessons is to consider and explore the question - What makes a community? We will look at our contributions in school and in the wider area and how people impact

about seasons and moon phases. The impact of the topic will inspire children to continue to question their environment and look at possibilities and barriers to the future of space exploration.

After half term, pupils will focus on forces. Pupils will study the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction using real life investigations. They will learn about working scientifically, how to record their investigations and thus the impact will provide pupils with skills to carry out future investigations.

COMPUTING
