Children will become more confident using practical resources such as Numicon so they can understand concepts better in order for them to become confident problem solvers.

Counting and recognition to 20.

Addition and subtraction.

One more and one less than a given number.

Shape space and measure: 3D shapes, length, weight and capacity.
